



### From the Lay Leader

So what the heck is the Prudential Council up to now, you might ask? Well, you may or may not know that our existing back-lighted church signs are in disrepair. The main sign that announces our upcoming weekly sermons has broken covers and is generally suffering the maladies of old age. The other sign that we use for announcing Second Saturday Supper and other special events has several major problems that will soon render it useless. Both signs need to be replaced as fixing them will be too costly, if even possible. Changing the lettering on these signs is very labor intensive and during the winter it can be bone chilling. Maynard, our custodian, is dealing with them for now but there will come a time in the near future when they are no longer serviceable.

But, there are some interesting options. The Prudential Council ("PC") has decided to investigate electronic, programmable signs that utilize LED technology. I'm sure you have seen these at other churches and businesses around town. The messages displayed can be changed anytime from inside the building using an existing computer. That means we would only need one sign for all of our messages and changing it only requires a few keystrokes! Another advantage is that these signs are virtually maintenance free for many years. The PC has recently seen a live demonstration and all of us were very impressed. Of course the bad news is the cost. It would be a major capital investment for our church, somewhat on the scale of air conditioning our sanctuary.

From time to time we are forced to look at capital investments such as this and determine if it is in the best interest of Mayflower Church, both now and in the future. We must prayerfully consider all of the possible outcomes before making a decision. We do not take our fiduciary responsibilities lightly.
